In her role she is responsible for managing a team of analysts, responding to CyberTipline Reports made by members of the public, and improving the process and response to survivors of child sexual exploitation. Ms. Shaw has been with the Exploited Children's Division (ECD) since 2019 where she started as a CyberTipline analyst. Throughout her time with ECD, Ms. Shaw has been part of several teams that facilitate communications with law enforcement as well as with members of the public.

Additionally, she represents the ECD through presentations and trainings with law enforcement and she contributes to projects that work to provide customized processing approaches.
